What Version 0.7.8 Represents

DraftAtlas 0.7.8 QA17 extends the internal qualification program after another productive independent Windows pass. The candidate keeps the readable DraftAtlas-controlled dropdown system and repairs the label, keyboard-exit, Character-evidence, possessive relationship, and cross-workspace consistency gaps that QA16 exposed, while retaining the writing, pages, project knowledge, governed relationships, Consultation, editorial review, visual understanding, recovery, professional handoff, and packaged operation proven earlier.

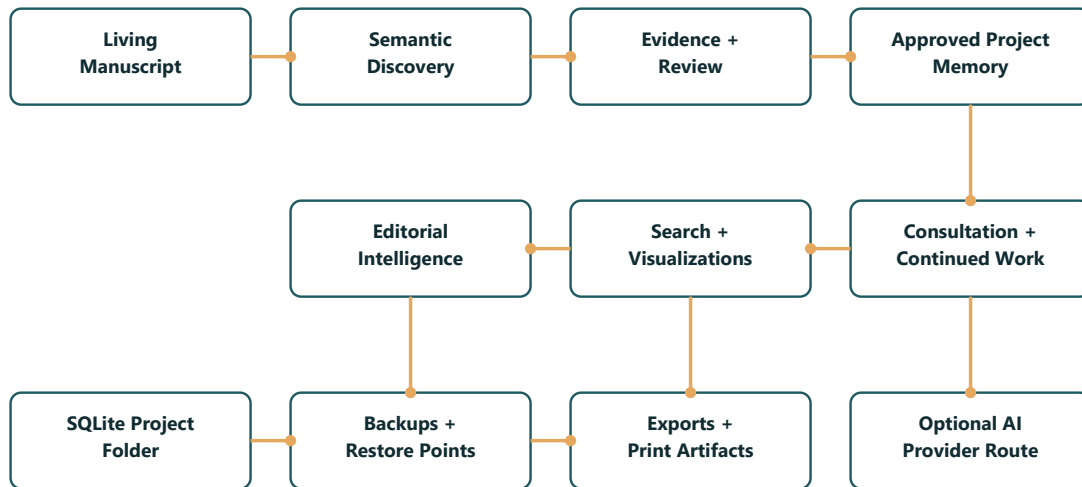
The product remains in development and is not publicly available. This report records verified progress without implying a download, preorder, release date, or completed external qualification.

DraftAtlas is the place where the project lives. The manuscript remains central. Potential knowledge stays reviewable. Evidence remains visible. AI is optional. The creator decides what becomes approved project knowledge.

WHY THE WORK MATTERS

One Complete Creative Loop

A creator can write or import material, review potential project knowledge with its supporting evidence, decide what belongs in the project Bible, and then use that approved knowledge across search, continuity, maps, relationships, editorial review, consultation, recovery, and professional output.



The result is not a manuscript surrounded by unrelated utilities. It is one evolving project system whose instruments share identity, evidence, decisions, and recovery boundaries.

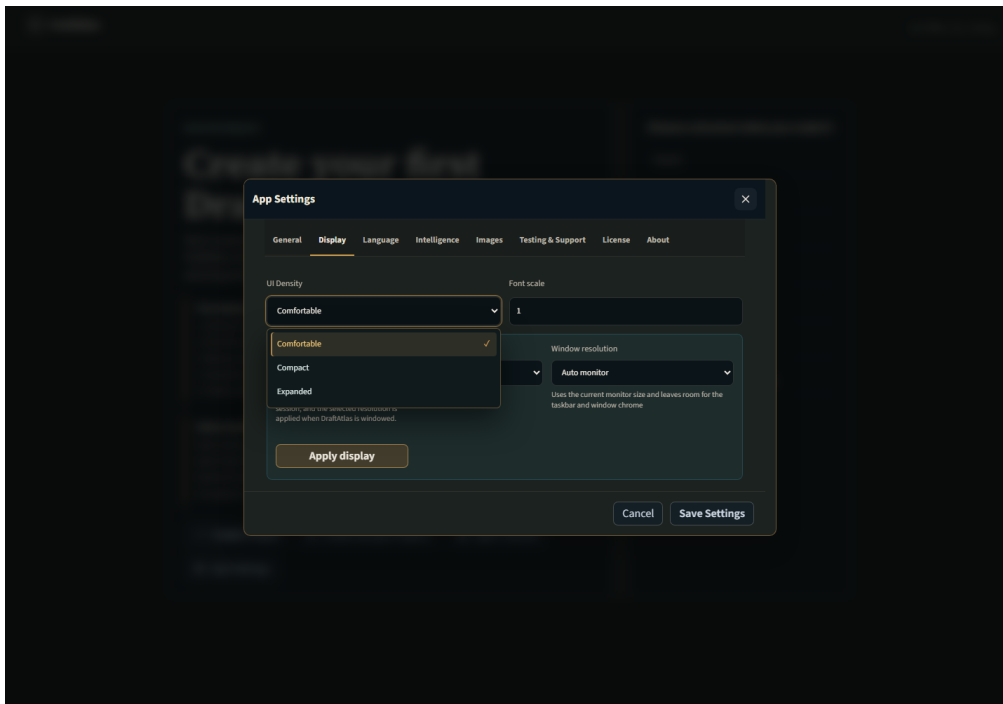

Independent QA13 found real defects in the Story Details review loop. QA14 repaired the central loop, QA15 added governed relationship decisions and a faster evidence-governed Conversation method, and QA16 replaced unreliable native dropdown panels app-wide. Claude's QA16 pass confirmed the core dropdown gain and then exposed narrower

label, keyboard, evidence-linking, possessive-language, and relationship-summary failures. QA17 owns those findings in one project-scoped implementation and carries them into a focused privacy-safe replay. Public distribution remains restricted while outside confirmation continues.

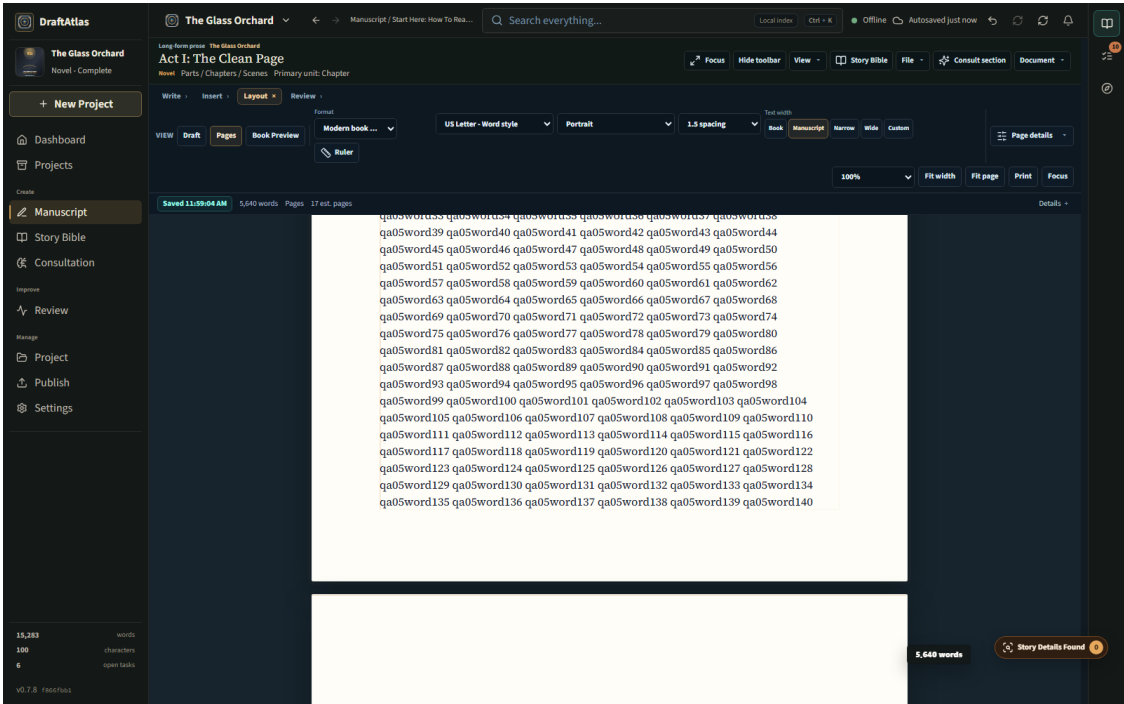


The DraftAtlas-owned menu remains readable across the application; QA17 completes its human labels and keyboard exit behavior.

MANUSCRIPT RESPONSIVENESS

Writing Without Losing the Studio

The writing surface was tuned so autosave, page layout, local writing review, and Story Details can remain available without taking over the act of typing. The governed sustained-writing run retained every character while keeping measured interaction latency bounded.

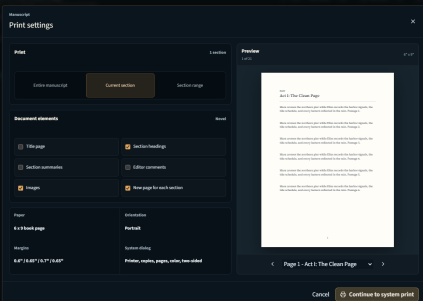


The Living Manuscript during sustained writing and background project work.

Project Knowledge Remains Governed

DraftAtlas can notice characters, places, relationships, events, and other potential knowledge without silently declaring them canon. Approved entries retain evidence and connections. If the source changes, the system can show that previously approved knowledge has lost current support.

- Story Bible for novels, short stories, screenplays, and picture books
- Series Bible for comics and graphic novels
- Recipe Bible for cookbooks
- Lore Bible for lore and RPG projects
- One shared Project Memory architecture beneath every medium
- Repeat discoveries now target existing knowledge instead of creating duplicate canon
- Unresolved proposal decisions remain available after accepted items are applied

NO UNIVERSAL SCENE TEMPLATE

Editorial Help That Respects Purpose

A quiet aftermath chapter should not be treated like a failed climax. Editorial Intelligence first considers what a chapter appears to be doing, then evaluates whether the available evidence supports that purpose. Findings remain reviewable observations, and intentional choices can be recorded.

Language review follows the same philosophy: locate the affected words, distinguish mechanical issues from style or intentional voice, and keep the creator in control. Whole-document review remains an explicit action rather than a permanent interruption.

EVIDENCE AS AN ARTIFACT

Relationships and Maps Become Visible

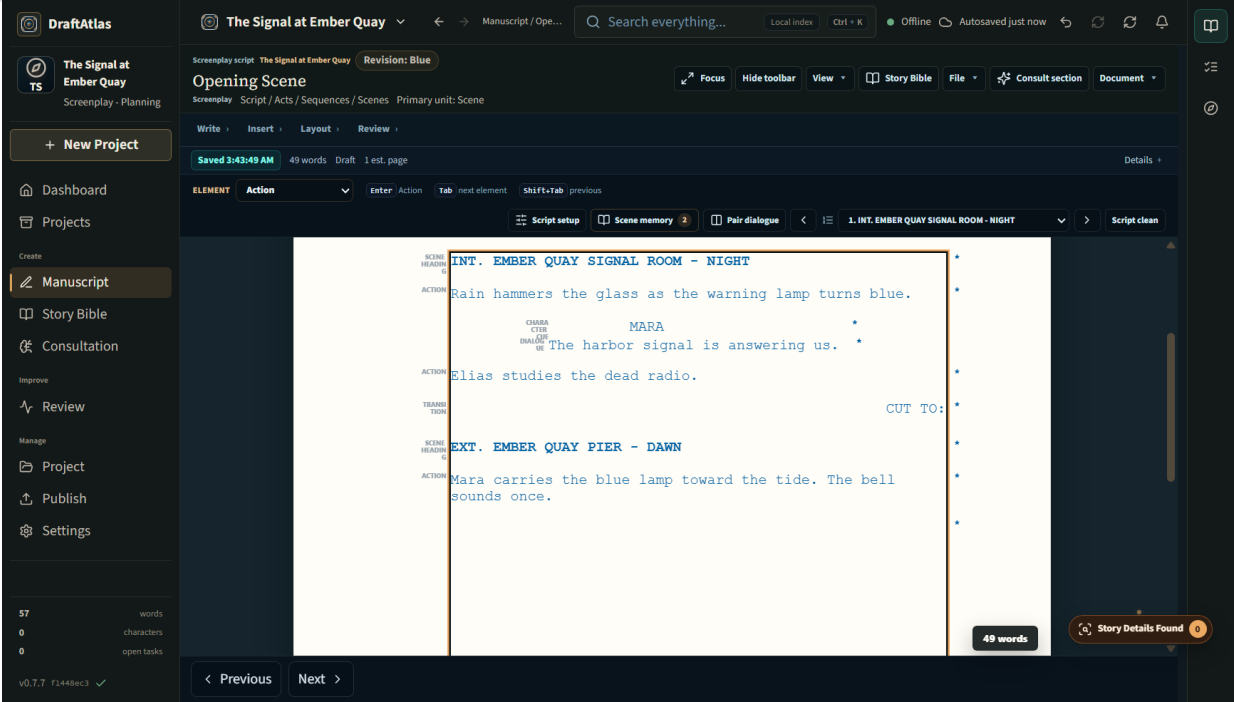
Relationship and place maps now adapt detail to scale, separate labels from important cards, preserve authored route names, and carry the same scene into preview and professional artifacts. The goal is not an unexplained diagram. It is a view of the project that remains connected to evidence.

Relationship recommendations remain deliberately conservative. DraftAtlas can show that a connection appears to exist without pretending it always knows the perfect human label. The creator can confirm or refine what the project means.

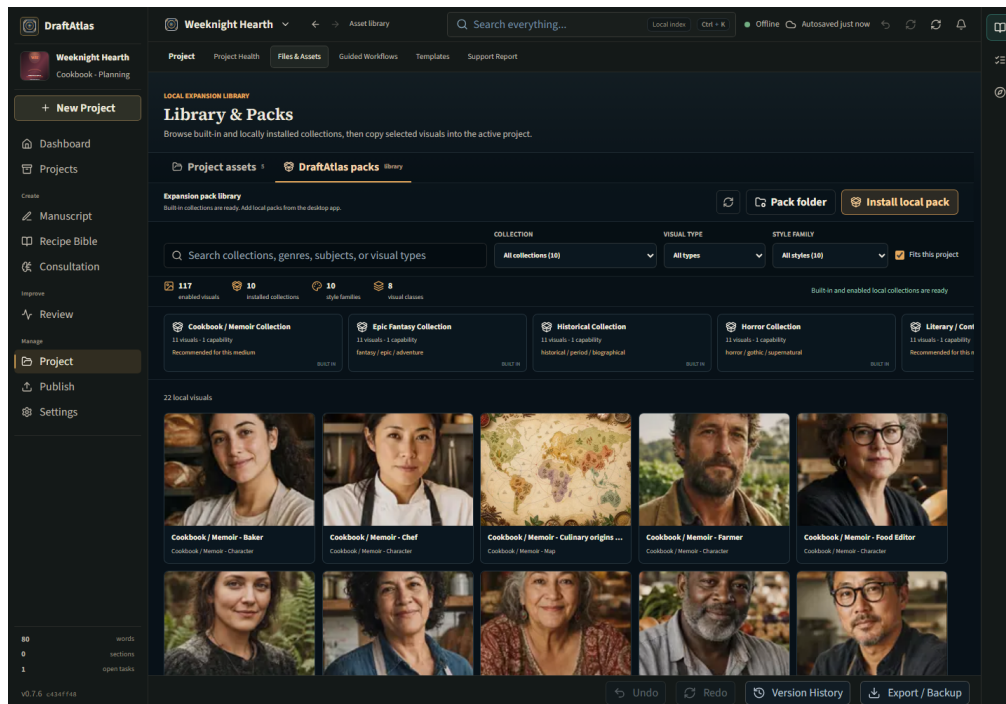

THE STUDIO CAN GROW

A Local Asset and Pack Library

DraftAtlas 0.7.8 qualifies a catalog of 5,000 local assets across 50 packs with checksums, accessibility descriptions, provenance records, portable paths, and contextual recommendations. The same pack system can support future free, first-party, commissioned, or licensed additions without making the core application dependent on a subscription.

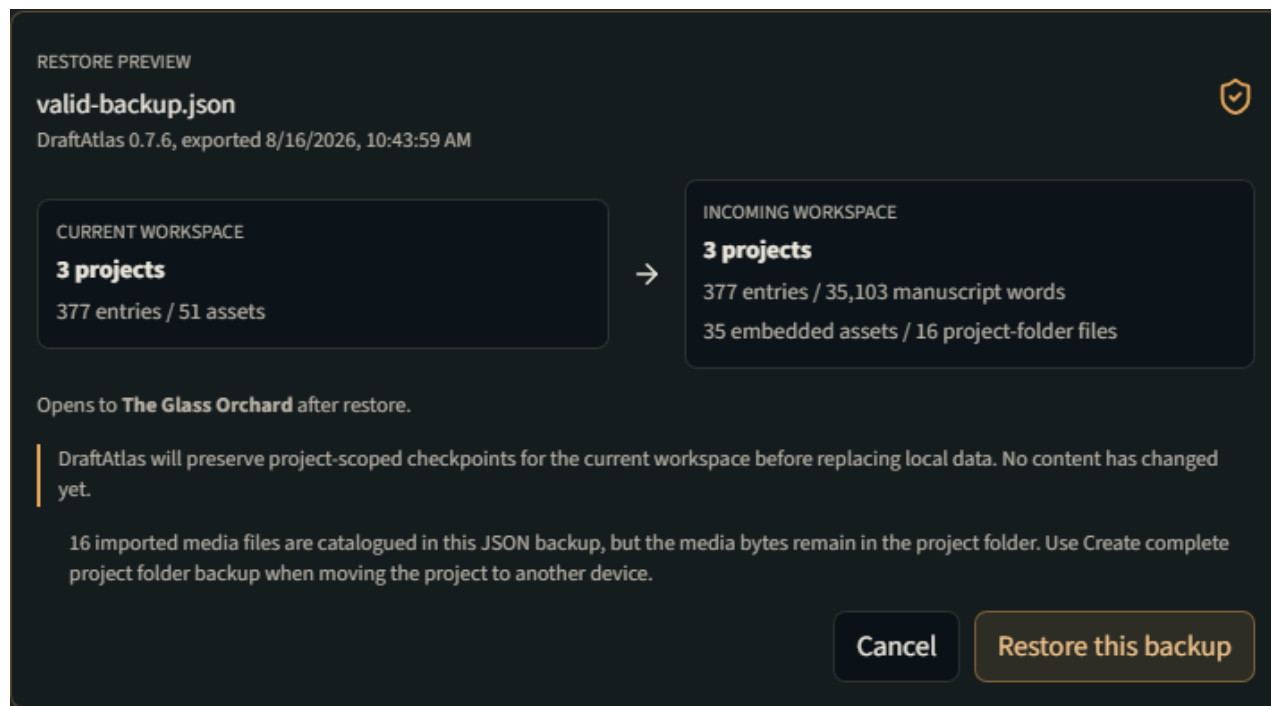


The pack library is a first-class studio surface, not a file-picker afterthought.

CREATIVE OWNERSHIP

Local-First and Recoverable

Core writing, project knowledge, search, maps, backup, restore, export, and health workflows remain local-first. AI can be disabled, run locally through Ollama, or connected to a selected cloud provider through explicit action. Cloud use is optional and scoped.



Backup and restore controls keep project protection visible.

The final candidate also passed install, update, uninstall, reinstall, project-isolation, privacy, provenance, support-operation, and artifact-fidelity checks. These internal results do not replace independent security or accessibility review.

HONEST DEVELOPMENT STATUS

What Remains

- Comprehensive independent testing against the frozen 0.7.8 candidate
- Windows signing and publisher-identity verification
- Legal, privacy, intellectual-property, and beta-language review
- Physical constrained and mainstream Windows hardware qualification
- Independent accessibility and security review
- Professional editor, screenwriter, printer, and publisher artifact acceptance
- Native macOS build, signing/notarization, parity, and recovery testing
- Trusted pilot and later controlled tester cohorts
